



WHEN BEEF GOES GRAY

That graying in beef is caused by oxidation, typically a harmless result of sitting on the shelf for a long time. It can also signal bacterial growth, which can lead to spoilage but generally won't make you sick. And since bacteria contaminate only the outer areas of solid meat cuts, they're destroyed by the high surface temperatures generated by cooking. To ensure safety, check that the center of the cut is heated to at least 145 degrees F (160 degrees F for ground beef). Clean anything that touches the raw meat, and refrigerate leftovers promptly.


