Our next game will be at the home of **Carl Johnson** on Monday, November 2nd.




Couples Duplicate Bridge Lo McCarley

In September, Explore and Dine traveled to Oakland to visit the Pardee House, built in 1868 by **Enoch Pardee**, and the former residence of his son **George Pardee** and his family. **George** was the governor of California during the aftermath of the 1906 San Francisco Earthquake, and apparently did a good job of managing the State's response. He was also instrumental in starting the East Bay Municipal Utility District, which includes Pardee Dam and Pardee Reservoir, and served as its president until 1941. **Mrs. Pardee** was an artist and a collector par excellence, and the house is chock-a-block with her many collections that range from glassware to a whole room full of candlesticks.

Our guide was a member of the extended Pardee family, and spent time during his youth in the house. The house was added on to several times, and the two remaining sisters who were his daughters arranged for a trust to take over the property after they died. The house is well maintained and made for a great tour. We wandered down to Max's near the 12th Street BART station for lunch.
